Investment objective


The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth by investing in a portfolio of Chinese shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of companies of any size that are based in or carry out the larger part of their business activities in, China, including Hong Kong SAR. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Companies considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund can invest up to 70% in China A and China B-shares, up to 10% of its assets in other funds, up to 10% in Real Estate Investment Trusts and may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments for treasury purposes. 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
